



How to Care for your Caravan Awning

After each trip, wash down your awning and allow it to dry completely before packing it away.

During long-term storage, extend and inspect it approximately every six months for mould, damage or repairs. For vinyl awnings, avoid household detergents and acidic cleaners, as these may damage the protective coating.

Use a mild truck wash or a suitable awning cleaner, following the product instructions. A Magic Eraser may help remove stubborn marks.

Reapply a water-resistant treatment when required. Canvas awnings and annexes must always be completely dry before storage.

Remove dirt, leaves and bird droppings with clean water and a soft brush.

Avoid harsh scrubbing, detergents and cleaning fluids unless approved by the canvas manufacturer.

Treat mould with a suitable canvas-safe mould remover, rinse thoroughly and allow the canvas to dry in full sun.

Regularly inspect stitching, zips, fittings and fabric. Addressing minor damage early can help prevent more costly repairs or replacement.
